The legislation proposed is still of great concern of responsibility it puts on counties. Also, there was a meeting with the Lake Berryessa Resort Improvement District community to discuss the status of their water situation and hopefully provide more education on the matter.

Supervisor Alfredo Pedroza mentioned the improvements to the Madison and Oak Hill cross road as well as the proposed roundabouts. Napa Valley Transportation Authority and Metropolitan Transportation Committee are working together on this effort and have been able to secure outside funding.

#### 16. BOARD OF SUPERVISORS FUTURE AGENDA ITEMS

Supervisor Diane Dillon stated that next month it is Preservation Month and I hope to get a proclamation on Napa County landmarks.

Vice Chair Brad Wagenknecht requested the Climate Emergency Resolution be agendized at a future meeting.

Supervisor Belia Ramos requested the same as Vice Chair Brad Wagenknecht and a request from Napa Schools 4 Change to consider a climate change emergency as well as the schools current initiatives on a fossil free future be agendized at a future meeting.

Director of Planning, Building, and Environmental Services David Morrison responded that a Climate Action Plan item will be brought to the Board around the month of May.
