WHEREAS, digital technologies today touch nearly every aspect of our lives — from our classrooms and communities, to our economy and personal, financial and national security; and

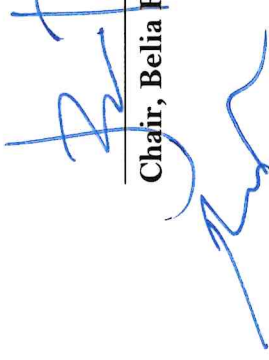

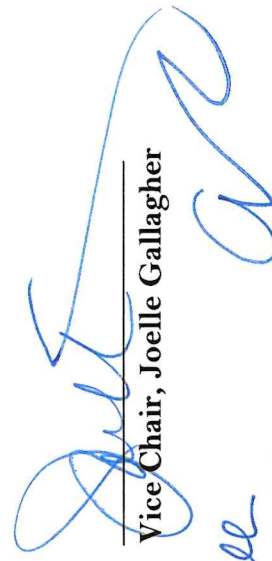
WHEREAS, maintaining the security of cyberspace is a shared responsibility in which each of us has a critical role to play; and
