DISCLOSURE OF CAMPAIGN CONTRIBUTIONS

Levine Act Compliance: The Levine Act (Government Code Section 84308) governs contributions in Board of Supervisor proceedings related to licenses, permits, or entitlements, as defined in the Act. Board members are prohibited from accepting contributions exceeding \$500 from parties, their agents, or participants during such proceedings and for 12 months after a final decision. If a Board member received a contribution exceeding \$500 within the past 12 months, disclosure is required on the record, and the member must not use their position to influence decisions. Parties and participants must disclose applicable contributions exceeding \$500 on the record, providing the following: • Name of the party or participant and any other person making the contribution • The name of the recipient • The amount of the contribution; and • The date the contribution was made. This information does not constitute legal advice. Parties and participants are advised to consult their legal counsel for guidance on compliance.

RECOMMENDATION

Adopt an Ordinance of the Napa County Board of Supervisors, State of California, adding Sections 2.10.050, 2.12.030, and 2.48.070 to the Napa County Code relating to the timing of elections for the offices of Assessor-Recorder-County Clerk, Auditor-Controller, and Treasurer-Tax Collector. (No Fiscal Impact)

BACKGROUND

At its regular meeting on October 21, 2025, the Board of Supervisors directed staff to return with a proposed ordinance consolidating five countywide elected offices controlled by California Elections Code section 1300 to the presidential election cycle.

These offices were previously consolidated on the gubernatorial election cycle, but a 2022 change in state law required counties to move the offices of Sheriff and District Attorney to the presidential election cycle. That same state law gave counties discretion to keep the remaining countywide offices, with the exception of the office of superintendent of schools (to which section 1300 does not apply), on the gubernatorial cycle or move them to the presidential cycle with the Sheriff and District Attorney.

As a result of this 2022 change, the terms of office of sheriffs and district attorneys statewide were extended by two years.

In Napa County, the countywide offices remaining on the gubernatorial election cycle are those of Assessor-Recorder-County Clerk; Auditor-Controller; and Treasurer-Tax Collector. As with the offices of Sheriff and District Attorney, moving these elections to the presidential election cycle would extend the terms of those offices one time for two years; the next election for those offices would occur in the March, 2028 presidential

primary election.

The proposed ordinance consolidating those offices to the presidential election cycle was introduced at the November 18, 2025, regular meeting of the Board of Supervisors. The Board, by unanimous vote, indicated its intent to adopt the ordinance.

Requested Action: Adopt the proposed ordinance adding sections 2.10.050, 2.12.030, and 2.48.070 to the Napa County Code as set forth in the item attachment.

AN ORDINANCE OF THE NAPA COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS, STATE OF CALIFORNIA, ADDING SECTIONS 2.10.050, 2.12.030, AND 2.48.070 TO THE NAPA COUNTY CODE RELATING TO THE TIMING OF ELECTIONS FOR THE OFFICES OF ASSESSOR-RECORDER-COUNTY CLERK, AUDITOR-CONTROLLER, AND TREASURER-TAX COLLECTOR

WHEREAS, Elections Code Section 1300 was amended in 2022, to require the elections to select the District Attorney and Sheriff to be held with the presidential primary election; and

WHEREAS, Elections Code Section 1300(b)(2) authorizes a county board of supervisors to adopt an ordinance to hold an election to select any county officer other than a county superintendent to schools with the presidential primary; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors intends to establish that the election for the offices of (1) Assessor-Recorder-County Clerk, (2) Auditor-Controller, and (3) Treasurer-Tax Collector to be held at the same time as the presidential primary.

The Napa County Board of Supervisors, State of California, ordains as follows:

SECTION 1. Section 2.10.050 (Time of election of assessor-recorder-county clerk) of Chapter 2.10 (Assessor-Recorder-County Clerk) of the Napa County Code is hereby added to read in full as follows:

2.10.050 Time of election of assessor-recorder-county clerk.

- A. Under the authority of Elections Code Section 1300(b)(2), the election to select the office of Assessor-Recorder-County Clerk shall be held with the presidential primary.
- B. The Assessor-Recorder-County Clerk elected in 2022 shall serve a six-year term and the next election for that office shall occur at the 2028 presidential primary.

SECTION 2. Section 2.12.030 (Time of election of auditor-controller) of Chapter 2.12 (County Auditor) of the Napa County Code is hereby added to read in full as follows:

2.12.030 Time of election of auditor-controller.

- A. Under the authority of Elections Code Section 1300(b)(2), the election to select the office of Auditor-Controller shall be held with the presidential primary.
- B. The Auditor-Controller elected in 2022 shall serve a six-year term and the next election for that office shall occur at the 2028 presidential primary.

SECTION 3. Section 2.48.070 (Time of election of treasurer-tax collector) of Chapter 2.48 (Treasurer-Tax Collector) of the Napa County Code is hereby added to read in full as follows:

2.48.070 Time of election of treasurer-tax collector.

- A. Under the authority of Elections Code Section 1300(b)(2), the election to select the office of Treasurer-Tax Collector shall be held with the presidential primary.
- B. The Treasurer-Tax Collector elected in 2022 shall serve a six-year term and the next election for that office shall occur at the 2028 presidential primary.

SECTION 4. The Board of Supervisors finds that pursuant to the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA), it can be seen with certainty that there is no possibility the proposed action may have a significant effect on the environment and therefore CEQA is not applicable. [See Guidelines For the Implementation of the California Environmental Quality Act, 14 CCR 15061(b)(3)].

SECTION 5. If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase or word of this ordinance is for any reason held to be invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this ordinance. The Napa County Board of Supervisors hereby declares it would have passed and adopted this ordinance and each and all provisions hereof irrespective of the fact that any one or more of said provisions be declared invalid.

SECTION 6. This ordinance shall be effective thirty (30) days from and after the date of its passage.

SECTION 7. A summary of this ordinance shall be published at least once five (5) days before adoption and at least once before the expiration of fifteen (15) days after its passage in the Napa Valley Register, a newspaper of general circulation published in Napa County, together with the names of members voting for and against the same.
