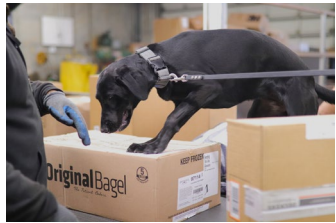
Organic Farming

83 packages inspected at parcel facilities, 6 rejections issued, 1 regulated pest detected



Incoming Inspections

2,770 shipments inspected for invasive pests, with 2,634 CA-origin plant deliveries, 130 out-of-state plant deliveries, and 6 east coast deliveries of outdoor host material inspected

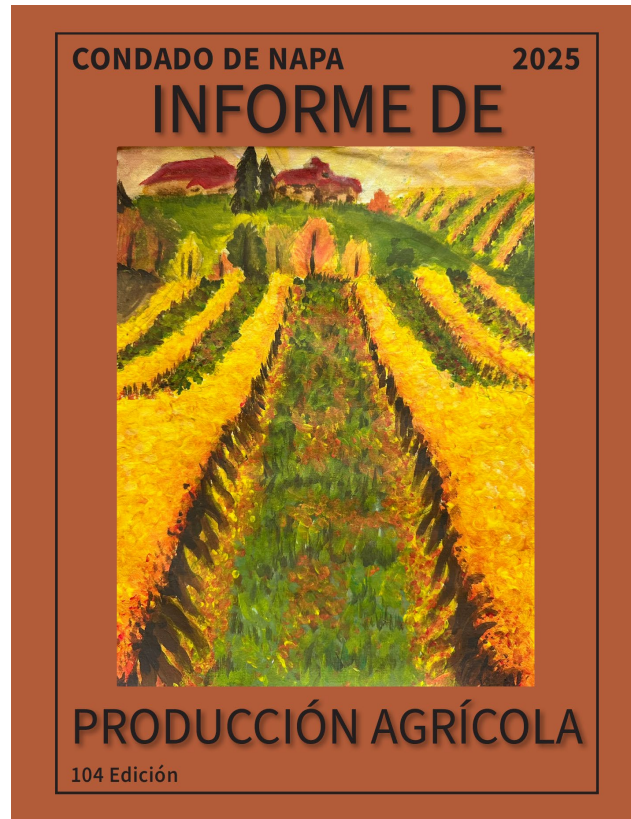
