DISCLOSURE OF CAMPAIGN CONTRIBUTIONS

Levine Act Compliance: The Levine Act (Government Code Section 84308) governs contributions in Board of Supervisor proceedings related to licenses, permits, or entitlements, as defined in the Act. Board members are prohibited from accepting contributions exceeding \$500 from parties, their agents, or participants during such proceedings and for 12 months after a final decision. This information does not constitute legal advice. Parties and participants are advised to consult their legal counsel for guidance on compliance.
