

FLOOD CONTROL AND WATER CONSERVATION DISTRICT

5/13/69 Funding Allocations by the District to drainage projects within incorporated cities in the County of Napa

1. Any project proposed for use of these funds must be determined by the District to be of general benefit.
2. Such projects must be in conformance with an overall drainage plan, or if no such plan has been developed, must, as determined by the District, be reasonably adaptable to such a plan.
3. The District will contribute up to one-half of allowable drainage facility costs on qualifying projects.
4. Allowable drainage facility costs shall not include any cost reimbursable by other agencies.
5. Allowable drainage facility costs shall not include expenditures from any source used to provide required matching funds for other programs, including road programs.
6. Drainage facility costs shall not include costs for drainage conduits less than thirty inches in inside diameter or for appurtenances to such conduits.
7. No District funds will be disbursed on approved projects until adequate documentation as to actual costs and acceptability of the installed drainage facilities has been furnished to the District.
8. The amount of funds available to a city each fiscal year, exclusive of funds carried over from prior years, shall be equal to the revenue from five cents of the total District tax levied on the assessed valuation within the city for the previous fiscal year. This assessed valuation shall be the total of the secured, unsecured, and utility valuations within the incorporated limits of the city.
9. Any balance of funds allocated to a city remaining at the end of a fiscal year will be carried over into the next fiscal year unless the balance is in excess of \$5,000 or three times the amount allocated to the city for the ending fiscal year exclusive of funds carried over from prior years, whichever is the greater amount. Larger amounts may be carried over subject to the city obtaining prior approval from the Flood Control District for the project or projects on which such funds are proposed to be used.

12/3/69 Services to be Provided (Resolution No. 69-97)

1. The Flood Control District staff is available to offer guidance and advice with regard to drainage problems along any flood channel within the District.
2. The Flood Control District is not in a position to assist, except in an advisory capacity, toward the correction of bank erosion problems along any major channel within the District which has not been accepted by the District.
3. The Flood Control District will assist any interested property owners toward the development of projects which would result in the improvement of flood channels within the District to adequate standards. Such projects, when completed, may, at the discretion of the Board, be accepted by the Flood Control District for operation and maintenance.
4. The Flood Control District will in emergency situations continue to assist in the removal of substantial obstructions to flow in major channels within the District, provided any necessary access rights and disposal sites are provided without cost to the District.

7/23/76 The Flood Control and Water Conservation District was consolidated with the County Public Works Department effective September 1, 1976; the Director of Public Works was designated as the District Engineer of the Flood Control and Water Conservation District and the District Engineer of the Flood Control and Water Conservation District was reclassified to Assistant Director of Public Works/Flood Control and Water Conservation District.

3/8/77 Water Conservation Policy

County of Napa is experiencing the second of two extremely dry years in which the need to conserve water for present, and/or a future potential third dry year, is very apparent. To this end the Board of Supervisors hereby adopts the following policy:

1. That the District Engineer be directed to publicize water conservation measures through the news media. The goal being to reduce water use by 25 percent.
2. That County facilities implement water conservation measures to:
 - a. Reduce water use by a minimum of 25 percent.
 - b. Comply with the goals of the agency in which the facility is located, if that agency's goals are more restrictive than the County's.

3. To request those users of water within the Lake Berryessa Resort Improvement District and Napa Berryessa Resort Improvement District to reduce water consumption by 25% through a voluntary program. This request to be included with the next regular billing.
4. That the District Engineer be directed to compile a list of users of ground water and request water conservation measures of them.
5. That the District Engineer be requested to develop a contingency plan for drought emergency including but not limited to:
 - a. A list of potential alternate sources of water, i.e., existing wells, reservoirs, etc.
 - b. Develop sources of equipment for conveyance, i.e., pipe, tank trucks, pumps, etc.
 - c. Continue surveillance of the ground water basin.
