

RESOLUTION NO. 2026-

A RESOLUTION OF THE NAPA COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS, STATE OF CALIFORNIA CONSOLIDATING THE MUNICIPAL ELECTIONS OF THE CITY OF AMERICAN CANYON, THE CITY OF CALISTOGA, THE CITY OF NAPA, THE CITY OF ST. HELENA, AND THE TOWN OF YOUNTVILLE AND THE GOVERNING BOARD MEMBER AND BOARD OF TRUSTEE MEMBER ELECTIONS FOR THE NAPA COUNTY REGIONAL PARK AND OPEN SPACE DISTRICT, NAPA VALLEY UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT, CALISTOGA JOINT UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT, POPE VALLEY UNION ELEMENTARY SCHOOL DISTRICT, ST HELENA UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT AND NAPA VALLEY COMMUNITY COLLEGE DISTRICT, WITH THE STATEWIDE GENERAL ELECTION TO BE HELD ON NOVEMBER 3, 2026 AND INCLUDING BALLOT MEASURES FOR THE TOWN OF YOUNTVILLE CITY OF AMERICAN CANYON AND CITY OF ST. HELENA, AND DIRECTING THE REGISTRAR OF VOTERS AND ELECTIONS DIVISION TO CONDUCT THOSE ELECTIONS

WHEREAS, Elections Code sections 10400 and 10401 provide that municipal and district elections may be consolidated with a statewide election if ordered by the Board of Supervisors; and

WHEREAS, Elections Code section 10402.5 provides that municipal and district elections must be consolidated with a statewide election that is to be held on the same date; and

WHEREAS, Elections Code sections 1000 and 1001 provide that elections held on the first Tuesday after the first Monday in November of even-numbered years are statewide election dates and therefore November 3, 2026, is a statewide election date; and

WHEREAS, Elections Code section 10403 provides that whenever an election called by a district, city or other political subdivision for the submission of any question or proposition is to be consolidated with a statewide election, and the question or proposition is to appear on the same ballot as that provided for the statewide election, the municipality shall, at least 88 days prior to the date of the election, file with the Board of Supervisors, and a copy with the elections official, a resolution of its governing board requesting the consolidation, and setting forth the exact form of any question or proposition to be voted upon at the election as it is to appear on the ballot; and

WHEREAS, the City of Napa has adopted Resolution No. R2026-060, calling an election for the purpose of electing two members to the Napa City Council and requesting that the Napa County Board of Supervisors consolidate the municipal election with the statewide election; and

WHEREAS, the City of Calistoga has adopted Resolution Nos. 2026-30 and 2026-31 calling an election for the purpose of electing a mayor and two members to the Calistoga City Council and requesting that the Napa County Board of Supervisors consolidate the municipal

election with the statewide election; and

WHEREAS, the Town of Yountville has adopted Resolution No. 26-4427, calling an election for the purpose of electing a mayor and two members to the Yountville Town Council, submitting to the voters a ballot question related to the Town of Yountville's Measure Y (increase in appropriation limits), and requesting that the Napa County Board of Supervisors consolidate the municipal election with the statewide election; and

WHEREAS, the City of St. Helena has adopted Resolution Nos. 2026-063 and 2026-064 calling an election for the purpose of electing a mayor and two members to the St. Helena City Council and requesting that the Napa County Board of Supervisors consolidate the municipal election with the statewide election; and

WHEREAS, the City of St. Helena has additionally adopted Resolution No. 2026-070 calling for the placement of a general tax measure designated as Measure S on the ballot for the November 3, 2026 municipal election and requesting that the Napa County Board of Supervisors consolidate the election with the statewide election; and

WHEREAS, the City of American Canyon has adopted Resolution No. 2026-39 calling an election for the purpose of electing two members to the American Canyon Council and requesting that the Napa County Board of Supervisors consolidate the municipal election with the statewide election; and

WHEREAS, the City of American Canyon has additionally adopted Resolution No. 2026-57 calling for the placement of a general tax measure designated as Measure P on the ballot for the November 3, 2026 municipal election and requesting that the Napa County Board of Supervisors consolidate the election with the statewide election; and

WHEREAS, the Napa County Regional Park and Open Space District has adopted and submitted Resolution No. 26-02 asking the Board of Supervisor to consolidate the Napa County Regional Park and Open Space District governing board election for two governing members with the November 3, 2026 general election; and

WHEREAS, the governing board of the Napa Valley Unified School District has adopted Resolution No. 26-35 calling an election for the purpose of electing four members to the Board of Trustees of the Napa Valley Unified School District; and

WHEREAS, the governing board of the Calistoga Joint Unified School District has adopted Resolution No. 25-26-16 calling an election for the purpose of electing two members to the Board of Trustees of the Calistoga Joint Unified School District; and

WHEREAS, the governing board of the Pope Valley Union Elementary School District has adopted Resolution No. 2026-06 calling an election for the purpose of electing two members to the Board of Trustees of the Pope Valley Union Elementary School District; and

WHEREAS, the governing board of the St. Helena Unified School District has adopted Resolution No. 25-36 calling an election for the purpose of electing three members to the Board of Trustees of the St. Helena Unified School District; and

WHEREAS, the governing board of the Napa Valley Community College District has adopted Resolution No. 26-15 calling an election for the purpose of electing four members to the Board of Trustees of the Napa Valley Community College District; and

WHEREAS, the Cities of American Canyon, St. Helena, Napa, Calistoga, the Town of Yountville, the Napa County Regional Park and Open Space District, the Napa Valley Unified School District, the Pope Valley Union Elementary School District, the Calistoga Joint Unified School District, the St. Helena Unified School District, and the Napa Valley Community College District (collectively “Agencies”) have adopted and timely filed the required Resolutions with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors requesting that their elections be consolidated with the November 3, 2026, statewide general election, that Measures S, P and Y be included on the ballot, and that the Election Division of the Assessor-Recorder-County Clerk Department be directed to conduct the elections; and

WHEREAS, the Agencies have agreed to reimburse Napa County in full for the election services performed by the Election Division upon presentation of a bill for election services to the municipalities and the districts; and

WHEREAS, the Board believes consolidating all of the aforementioned elections, including the ballot measures, with the statewide general election would be cost effective and is the most appropriate manner in which to proceed.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Napa County Board of Supervisors, State of California, hereby orders and proclaims that the November 3, 2026, general municipal elections for the Municipalities shall be consolidated with the November 3, 2026, statewide general election and the aforementioned ballot measures shall appear on the ballot.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the following question, which the Town of Yountville has designated as Measure Y, shall be submitted to the Town voters, as set forth in the Town of Yountville’s Resolution 26-4427. The Registrar is hereby instructed to place the question on the ballot at said election in substantially the following form:

“To fully utilize TOT and sales tax generated from visitors for public services, parks and recreation, police and fire emergency programs, shall the appropriations limit set by Article 13B of the California Constitution be increased by \$3,000,000 plus ¼ of TOT revenues for the prior fiscal year, for each year for a four year period commencing FY 2027/2028? By approving this appropriation limit, no existing tax is increased and no new taxes are created.”	Yes

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the following question, which the City of St. Helena has designated as Measure S, shall be submitted to City voters, as set forth in the City of St. Helena Resolution 2026-070. The Registrar is hereby instructed to place the question on the ballot at said election in substantially the following form:

St. Helena City Services Measure. To maintain/improve St. Helena's long-term finances and maintain 911 fire/public safety response, St. Helena's infrastructure including repairing roads/potholes/sidewalks; reducing local wildfire risk by managing brush/other fuels; maintain parks; supporting	Yes
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local businesses; for other general city services; shall the measure be adopted establishing a ½¢ locally controlled sales tax, generating approximately \$2,000,000 annually until ended by voters, requiring independent audits, public spending disclosure, all funds benefiting St. Helena residents?" 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BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the following question, which the City of American Canyon has designated as Measure P, shall be submitted to City voters, as set forth in the City of American Canyon's Resolution 2026-57. The Registrar is hereby instructed to place the question on the ballot at said election in substantially the following form:

American Canyon Public Safety, Parks, City Services Measure. Shall an ordinance funding American Canyon's general City services, such as maintaining 911 response/ neighborhood police patrols; preventing crime; reducing wildfire risk by managing brush/ other flammable vegetation; addressing speeding/ unsafe driving; keeping public areas/ parks safe/ clean; maintaining and expanding safe places for children to play; maintaining parks, trails, youth/ adult recreation, senior programming, among others; by establishing a 1% sales tax, providing approximately \$3,700,000 annually until ended by voters, requiring audits, spending disclosure, funds locally controlled, be adopted? BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Napa County Board of Supervisors, State of California, hereby orders and proclaims that the November 3, 2026, governing board election for the Napa County Regional Park and Open Space District, the Pope Valley Union Elementary School District, the Calistoga Joint Unified School District, the Napa Valley Unified School District, the St. Helena Unified School District, and the Napa Valley Community College District shall be consolidated with the November 3, 2026, statewide general election.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the polls shall be open from the hours of 7:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m. on Election Day. The manner of holding the election and the procedure for voting for and against the Measures presented shall be as set forth in the Elections Code for local municipal elections which are consolidated with a statewide general election.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that all precincts established and all election officers appointed for the November 3, 2026, statewide general election shall be the precincts and election officers for the municipal and district elections, and the election officers shall conduct the election and make return thereof according to law.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Elections Code section 9280, et seq., shall apply to these municipal elections.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the entire text of the City of American Canyon's Measure P shall be printed in the voter information guide.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the entire text of the City of St. Helena Measure S shall not be printed in the voter information guide.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Election Division conducting the election may publish a notice of the election in a newspaper of general circulation within the County not later than fifty (50) days prior to the election.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the request of the Agencies, as set forth in their respective Resolutions, is approved and the Election Division of the Assessor-Recorder-County Clerk Department is hereby authorized and directed to procure and furnish those election services requested as is more fully set forth in the aforementioned resolutions.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Election Division is directed to submit to the Municipalities and the District a billing for the election services provided by the Election Division of the Assessor-Recorder-County Clerk Department in conformity with Elections Code 10002.
