GROUNDWATER PUMPING REDUCTION WORKPLAN IMPLEMENTATION

GPR Workplan Implementation

Guiding Framework:

- Focus on voluntary actions that achieve groundwater benefits for the Subbasin
- Assess the costs and benefits of alternative actions and focus on those that are most cost-effective
- Leverage existing programs and opportunities to generate value from a suite of voluntary actions
- Include adaptive management to adjust the program as data and sustainability indicators evolve
- Mandatory measures if voluntary programs do not achieve measurable reductions in groundwater pumping (e.g., mandatory metering/reporting)

Water Certification Partnership

- Certification concept updates
 - Voluntary, incentive-driven partnership to encourage expansion of water conservation practices
 - Partnership with existing certification programs or other third parties (e.g., Farm Bureau, Napa RCD, etc.) to recognize vineyards and wineries implementing practices
 - One component of a suite of NCGSA programs

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Updated Program Overview



- **Partnership:** working with existing certification programs or third parties
- **Practices:** irrigation management, recycling/wastewater use, processes and technology
- **Metering:** required (as a condition of receiving subsidy for certification costs)
- **Verification:** combination of audits and self reporting
- **Data:** third party receives data and aggregates it at AVA level
- **Calculations:** quantify water savings for practices implemented at AVA level
- **Reporting:** aggregate measures of impact/benefit across AVAs and Napa Valley Subbasin

Expanding Partnerships



- Existing certification programs
- New partners (e.g., Farm Bureau)
- New partnerships between multiple entities

Example Program Implementation



- Elements for implementation:
 - Conservation practice audit/verification
 - Data gathering, assembly, and reporting
 - Calculate/verify water conservation

Grower Incentives



- Financial incentives
 - Fees
 - Offset/subsidize certification costs
- Technical assistance
 - Grants
 - Irrigation management
 - Data collection and reporting
- Timing of any payments

Program Partnership Entities



Entity that develops and verifies water conservation practices

- Existing certification programs
- Other entities (e.g., Farm Bureau, RCD)
- New entity



Entity/software for data collection, aggregation, and reporting

- Existing certification programs
- Other entities (e.g., Farm Bureau, RCD)
- Data vendor / software solution
- Other new entity



Entity for water conservation verification and analysis

- Existing certification programs
- Other entities (e.g., Farm Bureau, RCD)
- Third party
- GSA

PROGRAM INCENTIVES CONCEPTS

Current Status



- Included in the certification partnership concept
- Expanding service and financial incentives
 - Includes summary of funding mechanisms
- 5 types of incentives:
 - Nudges
 - Planning
 - Implementation
 - Branding and Recognition
 - Partnership

Grower-Focused Incentives



- GSP/GSA partial fee deferral

- Certification costs (and costs for other potential GPR programs)

- Water conservation practice costs

- Data management and reporting costs (water tracking technology)

- Other water data costs (e.g., meters, sensors, or remote sensing)

- Other permitting / regulatory assistance



OUTREACH AND EDUCATION UPDATES

Outreach and Education Program Goals

- Expanding strategy to coordinate receiving feedback and building partners
- Voluntary expansion of water conservation through education and outreach:

Increase understanding of water issues

Connect stakeholders to Workplan information, programs, and resources

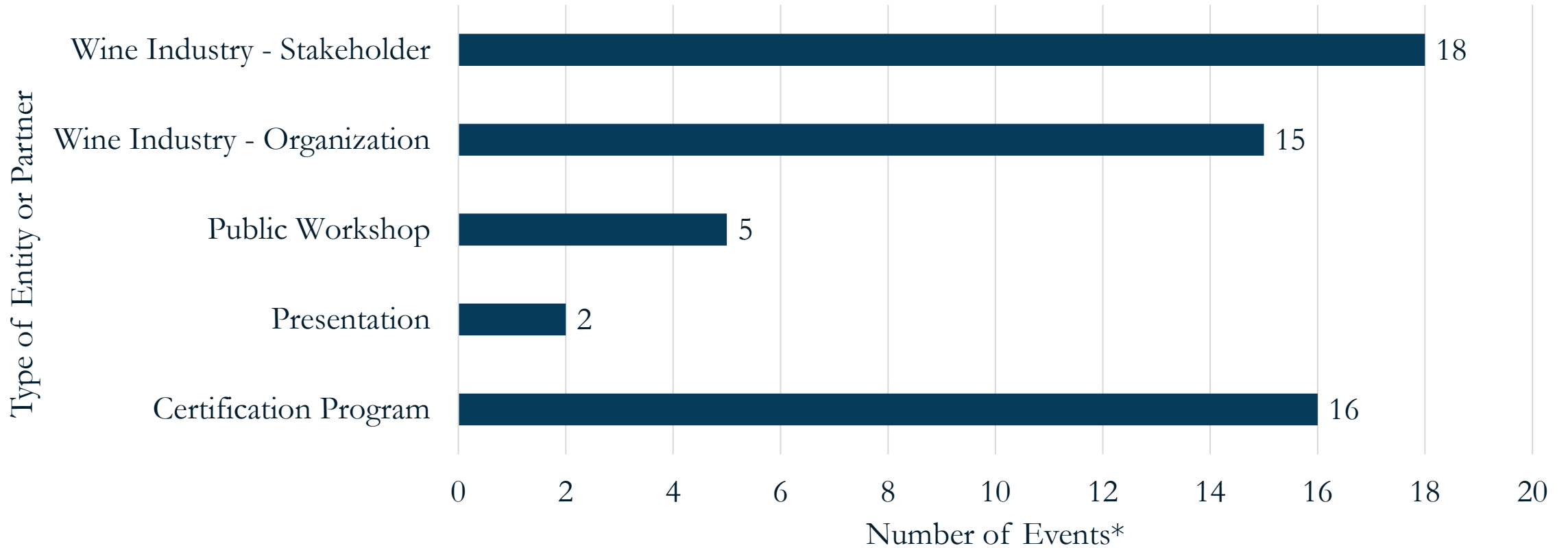
Create forums for exchange of feedback and input

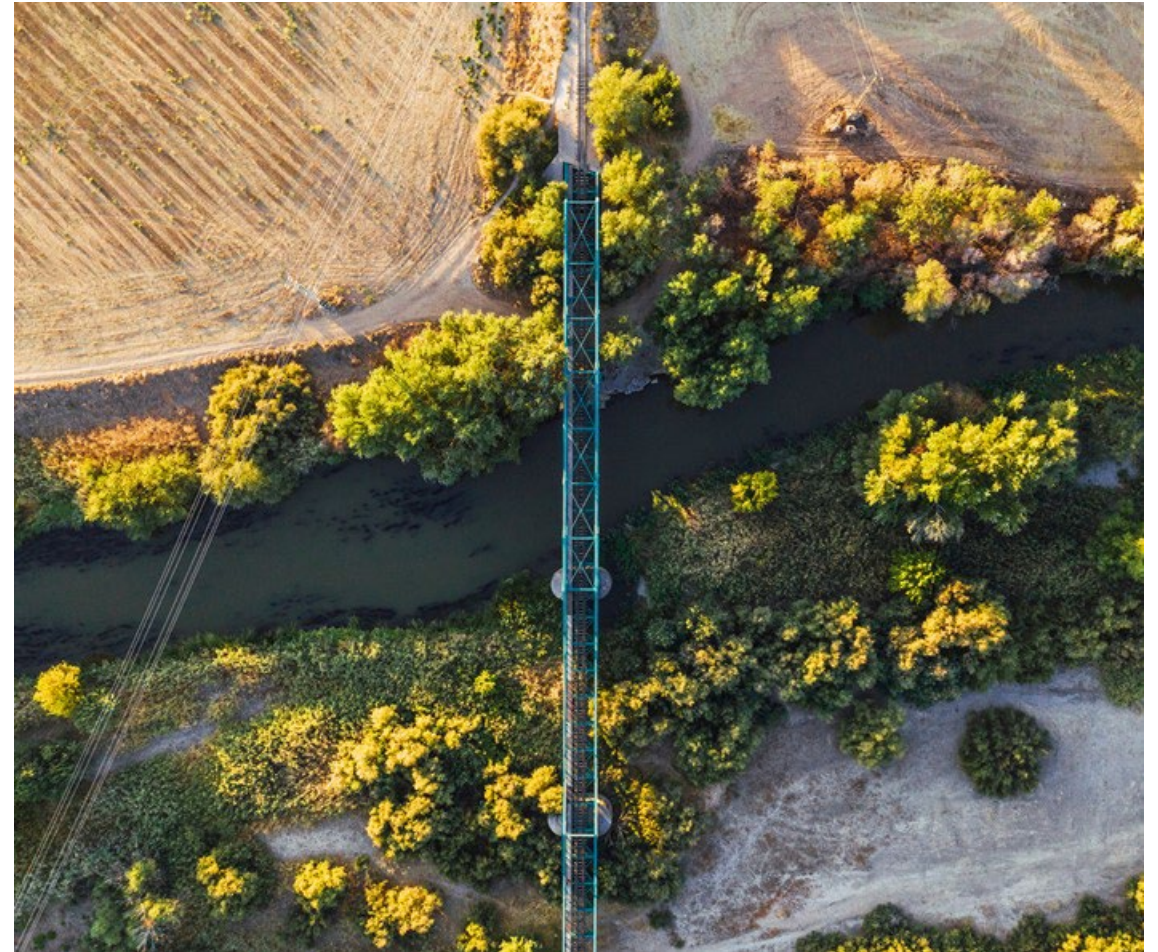


BENCHMARKING PROGRAM DEVELOPMENT UPDATES

Current Status

Benchmarking allows growers to compare their estimated water use over time to an anonymous peer group.

- Refining methodology and estimation process
- Designing and developing scorecard output
- Assessing performance in collaboration with test site





VOLUNTARY EXTENDED REPLANTING CONCEPT

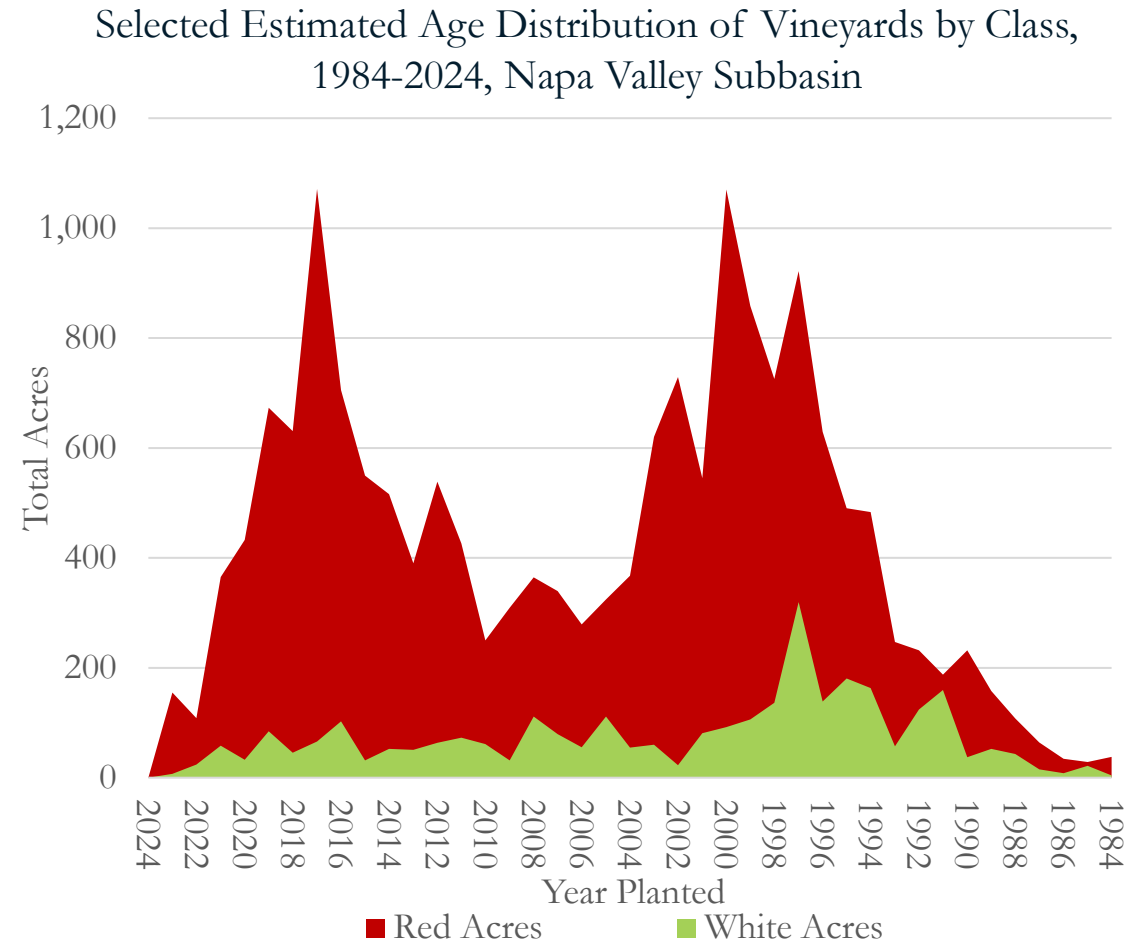
Extended Replant Water Conservation

- Program concept
 - Delay replanting for an extended period (e.g., 1, 2+ years)
 - Calculate and offer incentives to encourage participation
- Considerations
 - Current wine/winegrape market conditions
 - Opportunities for replant
 - Funding mechanisms
- Quantifying program water savings
 - Duration of program
 - Shifting replants



Extended Replanting Concept

- Incentive concept components
 - Groundwater Savings. Costs incurred (or avoided) and forgone income
 - Other Transition Practices. Potential additional incentive payments could be included for specific practices
 - Other Benefits. Payments for other public benefits. For example, other programs have payments for specific areas (e.g., near domestic wells)
