**RESOLUTION OF THE NAPA COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS  
ESTABLISHING NO PARKING – TOW AWAY ZONES ALONG CONN  
VALLEY ROAD BETWEEN MOORE CREEK PARK ENTRANCE AND  
THE CITY OF NAPA’S “PICNIC AREA”**

**WHEREAS**, Section 22507 of the California Vehicle Code authorizes a local authority to prohibit the parking of vehicles; and

**WHEREAS**, Section 22651(n) of the California Vehicle Code authorizes a local authority to remove parked vehicles from restricted parking areas designated as a tow away zone; and

**WHEREAS**, the Napa County Regional Park and Open Space District (NCRPOSD) has submitted a letter, attached hereto as Exhibit “A”, to the County describing adverse impacts that parking along Conn Valley Road between the Moore Creek Park entrance and the City of Napa’s “Picnic Area” has caused for residents and visitors to the area, including cars parked within the travel lane in a manner that could impede traffic and emergency vehicle access, and narrowing of the travel lane due to the roadway’s curved nature and narrow paved surface in some areas; and

**WHEREAS**, Napa County seeks to ensure a safe and efficient road network; and

**WHEREAS**, certain county roadways have been determined by an engineering study to require such regulation; and

**WHEREAS**, the portion of Conn Valley Road between the Moore Creek Park entrance and the City of Napa’s “Picnic Area” has been determined to require such regulation for the safety and efficiency of the roadway.

**NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED**, by the Napa County Board of Supervisors as follows:

1. Pursuant to Section 22507 and 22651(n) of the California Vehicle Code, the parking of vehicles be prohibited at the following location and any vehicles parked in the following locations shall be subject to tow:
  - Both sides of Conn Valley Road between Moore Creek Park Entrance and the City of Napa “Picnic Area”, as depicted on Exhibit “B”, attached hereto and incorporated herein by this reference.
2. The Road Commissioner is directed to install appropriate signage in furtherance of this resolution and in conformance with the Vehicle Code, including but not limited to Section 22651(n).
