**SUBJECT:** Renewal of Revenue Agreement with California Department of Food and Agriculture

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### RECOMMENDATION

Agricultural Commissioner/Sealer of Weights & Measures requests approval of and authorization for the Chair to sign renewal of Revenue Agreement No. 170213B with the California Department of Food & Agriculture (CDFA) for a maximum of \$369,988 for the term July 1, 2022 through June 20, 2024 for reimbursement of expenditures related to detection and exclusion of the Glassy-winged Sharpshooter.

### EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Approval of the requested action will renew the agreement with CDFA for reimbursement of services for trapping, inspection and outreach activities related to the Glassy-winged Sharpshooter.

### **BACKGROUND AND DISCUSSION**

This agreement provides for reimbursement of costs associated with the Glassy-winged Sharpshooter (GWSS) program. GWSS has been determined to be an effective vector for Pierce's Disease which poses a significant and eminent threat to Napa County's grape and wine industries. This contract helps fund GWSS trapping, detection, outreach and inspection of nursery plants coming into Napa County from GWSS infested counties. This agreement allocates \$369,988 over a two-year period to perform these activities as required.
