

## **National Crime Victims' Rights Week – April 19-25, 2026**

**WHEREAS**, crime affects individuals, families, and communities in profound and varied ways, often resulting in lasting physical, emotional, financial, and social harm; and

**WHEREAS**, no victim or survivor should face the effects of crime alone, and access to compassionate, comprehensive support is essential to healing and recovery; and

**WHEREAS**, there are more than 12,000 system- and community-based victim services programs across the Nation that help crime survivors and promote community safety, and over 32,000 laws that define and protect victims' rights; and

**WHEREAS**, the Napa County District Attorney's Office served more than 2,000 victims in 2025 and connected approximately 500 individuals to additional community-based resources, including housing, mental health services, and emergency financial assistance; and

**WHEREAS**, 2026 marks the 45th anniversary of National Crime Victims' Rights Week, first proclaimed in 1981, a longstanding observance that brings communities together to honor survivors, raise awareness, and reaffirm our shared commitment to justice and healing; and

**WHEREAS**, National Crime Victims' Rights Week provides an opportunity to recognize the strength and resilience of survivors, to elevate their voices, and to recommit to ensuring that all victims are treated with dignity, respect, and fairness.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT PROCLAIMED**, that this Board of Supervisors, County of Napa, State of California, does hereby designate the week of April 19-25, 2026 as National Crime Victims' Rights Week in Napa County, and reaffirms its commitment to advancing victims' rights and ensuring access to services and support every day of the year.
