The Land Trust of Napa County is pleased to report on another year of successful stewardship work that was funded by the Wildlife Conservation Commission. Your generous support toward our environmental education programming at the Mead Ranch Preserve (Funding Agreement #260092D) allowed us to pay for school bus transportation for two fourth grade classes from Pueblo Vista School, and to improve the Mead Ranch Preserve trail system. These improved trails were enjoyed by five fourth grade classes during their class field trips at the preserve this spring. We are extremely grateful to have been able to host more than 100 students at the preserve in 2026, and to provide them with opportunities to connect with and learn about vernal pool and chaparral habitat types, rare native plants, local wildlife, and nearby waterways in meaningful ways. Additionally, the Land Trust hosted two volunteer workdays and two guided public hikes on the preserve during the grant period. We appreciate your partnership in making all of this happen!

Now that these grant related projects are completed, we would like to request reimbursement in the amount of \$5,666.00. Please see the attached invoices and check stubs in the amounts of \$806.00 for the NVUSD school bus, and \$4,860.00 for our trail improvement work with the ACE crews.
