Purpose

This resume is submitted in support of my application for re-appointment to the Napa County Mental Health Board as an “interested and concerned citizen.”

Background Summary

I have been a practicing lawyer since 1971, admitted to practice in California, Arizona and the District of Columbia. I am now semi-retired, continuing to work on several matters of particular interest but able to devote the bulk of my time to other activities.

My wife Mary and I have owned our house in Yountville, and have been regular Napa visitors since 2003. When I scaled back my legal work, we moved to Northern California to live full time, and Yountville is our permanent residence. We have three grown daughters, two of whom live in Napa with their families.

September 2021 to present

- I retired from McKool Smith in September 2021 and now operate a solo practice pursuing matters of personal interest, primarily relating to refugees and others seeking asylum in the U.S.

McKool Smith P.C., Los Angeles, California

October 2011 to September 2021

- McKool Smith is a national law firm focused on litigation. In October 2011, my previous firm merged with McKool Smith.
- I am a Principal with the firm. My work with McKool Smith has been False Claims Act litigation, victims’ rights litigation and human rights litigation.

Hennigan Dorman, LLC, Los Angeles, California

May 1996-September 2011

- Hennigan Dorman was a Los Angeles law firm devoted entirely to litigation. Hennigan Dorman was established in the Spring of 1996 and I was recruited to join the firm when it was established.
- My practice centered on general commercial litigation and mediation, False Claims Act litigation and victims’ rights litigation.
- I was a partner in Hennigan Dorman throughout my tenure and, from approximately August 1996 until the merger with McKool Smith, was the Firm’s Managing Partner.

- The WSPF was formed in May 1973 to investigate matters related to the Nixon Administration and its personnel.
- I was an Assistant Special Prosecutor. My duties included investigations of various alleged criminal activities of persons in and associated with the Nixon Administration, including illegal campaign contributions and matters related to the attempt to suppress or discredit the Pentagon Papers disclosures by Daniel Ellsberg.
- I also served for a time as Assistant Counsel to the Special Prosecutor, representing the office in judicial proceedings.

Hon. Harold Leventhal, Washington, D.C. August 1971-July 1972

- After graduation from law school, I served as law clerk to Judge Harold Leventhal, United States Court of Appeals for the District of Columbia Circuit.
- As his law clerk, my duties were to assist Judge Leventhal with the evaluation of appeals brought before his Court, to perform research and to prepare draft opinions.

for family members of innocent bystanders of U.S. drone attacks; seeking compensation for victims of genocide and state violence in Sudan (Darfur, etc.); and litigation to compel adequate medical care for a seriously ill Guantanamo detainee.

- I have good analytical and communication skills, and am experienced in comparative evaluation of proposed solutions to complex problems.
- I have extensive experience and have been successful in collaborative problems solving. That comes, among other things, from my role as a law firm managing partner, from representing clients in settlement and mediation proceedings and from formal professional training in conducting mediations.
- I have a long-term interest in constructive social change. In addition to *pro bono* litigation work, I served on the Board of Directors of the Arizona Center for Law in the Public Interest for approximately 6 years and was its President for three. The work of the Arizona Center during my tenure with its Board involved complex issues and disputes related to mental health programs and funding.
- My wife and I have been regular participants in the workshops and roundtables of the “Live Healthy Napa County” study and program. Effective community response to mental health issues is of course a basic building block of any healthy community and an opportunity to participate in the Mental Health Board’s work is of great interest to me. Being semi-retired, I would be able to devote the time and attention necessary to be an active and contributing member of the Board.
