Supervisor Anne Cottrell reported on attending the Rural County Representatives of California (RCRC) annual meeting in Rohnert Park. During this meeting there was a tour at Sterling Vineyards to discuss wildfire recovery and resilience. Vice-Chair Cottrell thanked County Executive Officer Ryan J. Alsop for attending the meeting. Also during the meeting attendees received a presentation on large scale solar planning. Lastly she reported on the work being done with the Napa County grape growers regarding regenerative agriculture and the reception of a presentation from the dairy industry regarding the same.

Supervisor Belia Ramos applauded the efforts of the Suicide Prevention Council for a fantastic conference last week at the Napa Valley Performing Arts Center. Supervisor Ramos stated that "The keynote speaker shared a message that resonated with many in the audience and that was very impactful to see a very thoughtful conference." Chair Joelle Gallagher applauded the Suicide Prevention Council conference and stated the keynote speaker Candice Washington was amazing and that the County will look to post the video of the presentation once received to the public. Chair Joelle Gallagher announced the passing of Paul Bradford (Brad) Onorato, Chief of Staff to Congressman Mike Thompson for over 30 years. Brad touched many lives through his dedication to public service. He was down to earth, approachable, and he genuinely enjoyed helping others. Sincerest condolences were offered to Brad's family, friends, and to Congressman Thompson and his staff.

Supervisor Ryan Gregory reported out as the Napa County representative on the Napa Sanitation District Board stating the District will be having an open house on Saturday, September 28, 2024 from 10:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. The Linear Generator is the first of its kind to run off of Biogas from a treatment plant that generates electricity. There will be a ribbon cutting ceremony on Thursday, September 26, 2024 at 11:00 a.m. Supervisor Gregory also mentioned a large scale floating solar project that is in the works.
