Responsible for the development, coordination, and implementation of community child health initiatives to support an integrated system of pediatric health care. Responsible for clinical and administrative oversight of the Urban Health Network and Community Benefits at the senior level. Total budget \$1.5 million.

- Developed a network of 12 affiliated community health centers to support an integrated system of health care for urban children. The initiative resulted in a 2% increase in the overall urban market share for inpatient discharges, a 10% increase in inpatient discharges, and a 13% increase in specialty referrals from health centers participating in the network.

Total incremental revenue generated \$850,000.

- Established computer connectivity to 14 community health centers with the hospital's information system network. The connectivity facilitated the communication of clinical information, including inpatient discharge summaries, ambulatory notes, radiology and laboratory reports, and general hospital information, which resulted in enhanced provider satisfaction with communication from the hospital.
- Principal in the establishment of the Office of Child Advocacy, integrating the functions of the departments of Government Relations and Community Benefits. The Office serves as a model for pediatric advocacy at the local, state, and federal levels by aligning the hospital with community partners, supporting an integrated child health system, and advocating for legislative changes.
- Led the planning and design of public health child initiatives that focused on the prevention of childhood injuries, asthma, and access to health care. Programs developed include a child passenger safety program, a sports helmet safety program, a window guard program, an asthma camp, an asthma swim program, a community-based developmental evaluation program, and a shuttle service for urban families. Raised over \$500,000 in philanthropic support to enhance programmatic efforts.
- Led team of 40 employees and medical staff in completing an institution-wide assessment of diversity and cultural competency. As a result, a Diversity Council was established and comprises 25 members representing staff from a variety of departments, a cross-section of job levels, and diverse backgrounds. The council develops, leads, and coordinates institutional efforts; serves as an ambassador to staff; and identifies opportunities to enhance cultural competency.
- Participated in the development of a comprehensive institutional signage program that includes primary signage in English & Spanish, color and symbol coded, and locator kiosks in the main lobby to assist families in finding their way, available in six languages.

Provided leadership, accountability, vision, and direction of a comprehensive community health center serving 10,000 urban Latino and African American families. Operating budget of \$5.4 million with 150 employees and providing 56,000 patient visits per year. Services include Pediatric Medicine, Adolescent Medicine, Women's Health, Internal Medicine, Human Services, Optometry, Nutrition, Laboratory, Newborn Home Visiting, HIV Prevention, Testing & Treatment, and Substance Abuse Treatment. Responsible for oversight of clinical programs, compliance, operations, strategic planning, business development, finances, and marketing.

- Developed, engaged, and supported an 18-member active and participatory Community Board, representing the community and consumers served by the health center, to advise and guide health center programmatic activities.
- Led efforts to construct a 25,000-square-foot state-of-the-art health facility.

- Led the development of grant proposals to support public health initiatives at the health center, addressing infant mortality, HIV/AIDS prevention, domestic and youth violence, and substance abuse. Total awards: \$2.2 million.
- Raised \$500,000 in private philanthropic funding to support health center programs and establish an endowment for the center.
- Developed and oversaw re-engineering of front-line registration processes, which resulted in an 8-minute decrease in waiting time for patients to complete registration.
- Led the revision of patient encounter forms and the training of providers on compliance with coding and documentation. Efforts resulted in a \$1 million increase in gross patient revenue.
- Developed and led strategies to enroll uninsured and underinsured children and families into a health insurance program. Efforts resulted in a 20% center-wide decrease in self-pay/uninsured patients; 99% of children receiving care at the health center were enrolled in an insurance program.
- Expanded hours of operation include evening and weekend hours that resulted in a 10% increase in patient volume and revenue enhancement of \$250,000.
- Established productivity standards for clinical providers and an annual peer review physician evaluation process that resulted in a net increase of patient volume by 5% and enhanced physician satisfaction.
- Integrated residency training in pediatric medicine and combined internal medicine/pediatric medicine, fellowship training in general pediatric medicine, and the training of pre-doctoral minority psychology and social work students into 3 clinical care programs. Three general pediatric fellows, 10 pediatric residents, 4 internal medicine/pediatric residents, 12 psychology interns, and 5 social work students successfully completed their training.
- Recruited and retained six faculty physicians of color to provide clinical care.
- Established a medical student mentorship program for youth in the neighborhood served by the health center. Twenty-three medical students served as mentors for 17 neighborhood youth.
