8. BOARD OF SUPERVISORS REPORTS AND ANNOUNCEMENTS

Supervisor Ryan Gregory reported on attending his eighth trip to the National Association of Counties (NACo) legislative conference along with Vice-Chair Anne Cottrell, County Executive Office Legislative & Policy Analyst Andrew Mize, and Deputy County Executive Officer of Communication Holly Dawson where they discussed the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) Building Resilient Infrastructure and Communities (BRIC) grant and how the funds will be spent and mentioned that there would be a more detailed report out soon. They also met with Housing and Urban Development to discuss the statistics and interest level of the Accessory Dwelling Unit (ADU) Forgivable Loan program, and new funding sources coming soon. They also met with the White House Intergovernmental Affairs Office to discuss how the County was spending American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) funds and the insurance problem with the BRIC grant, which led to some suggestions on wildfire mitigation and home hardening.

Vice-Chair Anne Cottrell acknowledged Supervisor Gregory's report on the NACo legislative conference and that they met with Congressman Mike Thompson to discuss wildfire issues and federal support for home hardening efforts, and the concern about AT&T trying to get out of their responsibility as the Carrier of Last Resort. She also reported they met with staff of Senator Robert Padilla's office regarding the BRIC grant and some of the issues Sonoma County is facing. Vice-Chair Cottrell also reported on conversations with Napa County growers on the tract 2 replant process and opportunities to improve water efficiency, drought, and heat tolerance. She requested a report from Planning, Building and Environmental Services staff to educate the public on these issues and showcase how the County is working with growers to resolve those issues. Lastly, Vice-Chair Cottrell requested County Executive Officer Ryan J. Alsop report on a letter recently sent out to all County employees.

County Executive Officer Ryan J. Alsop reported on an email that he sent to all County employees regarding several requests from the federal government through incoming subpoenas that have garnered media attention and that he remains focused on the daily business of the County and the services provided by its dedicated and hard-working employees.

Supervisor Alfredo Pedroza reported on working with the Napa Valley Transportation Authority (NVTA) around a potential extension to a sales tax for roads and requested a future report out from Director Steven Lederer regarding the County's use of Measure T funds and the road work that has been completed. He also acknowledged NVTA Executive Director Kate Miller on her efforts.
