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AN ORDINANCE OF THE NAPA COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS, STATE OF CALIFORNIA, AMENDING CHAPTER 2.100 (PERSONNEL) OF TITLE 2 (ADMINISTRATION AND PERSONNEL) OF THE NAPA COUNTY CODE RELATING TO ADMINISTRATIVE LEAVES OF ABSENCE

WHEREAS, on April 18, 2005, Chapter 2.100.235 was last amended by Ordinance 1257; and

WHEREAS, the Napa County Board of Supervisors now wishes to amend portions of Chapter 2.100 in order to give the Napa County Director of Human Resources more discretion about when to place employees on an administrative leave of absence.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Napa County Board of Supervisors, State of California, ordains as follows:

SECTION I. Section 2.100.235 (Administrative leaves of absence with pay) of Chapter 2.100 (Personnel) of the Napa County Code is hereby amended to read in full as follows:

2.100.235 Administrative leaves of absence with pay.

When a particularan employee may have been is involved in a matter which requires an investigation, and the county's best interest would be served therebyor if it is in the County's best interest, a department head may place that an employee on an administrative leave of absence with pay for up to three workdays. In granting such leave, the department head or his/hertheir designated representative shall seek prior approval from the human resources department division. The department head Director of Human Resources or his/hertheir designeeated representative may grant additional leave of absence with pay of up to twenty sixty workdays upon written approval from the county executive officer or his/her designated representative. At the end of sixty-three days, the County Executive Officer or their designated representative may for good cause grant up to an additional thirty days of leave of absence with pay, at the Director of Human Resources' request. Any further extension of such leave shall require the approval of the Board of Supervisors.

SECTION II. If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase or word of this ordinance is for any reason held to be invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this ordinance. The Napa County Board

of Supervisors hereby declares it would have passed and adopted this ordinance and each and all provisions hereof irrespective of the fact that any one or more of said provisions be declared invalid.

SECTION III. This ordinance shall be effective thirty (30) days from and after the date of its passage.

SECTION IV. A summary of this ordinance shall be published at least once five (5) days before adoption and at least once before the expiration of fifteen (15) days after its passage in the Napa Valley Register, a newspaper of general circulation published in Napa County, together with the names of members voting for and against the same.
